- A. Stanley Kowalski: common, working class man; physical; realistic; belligerent
- B. Stella DuBois Kowalski: Stanley's wife; has forgotten genteel upbringing in order to enjoy her marriage to a man of a lower social class
- C. Blanche DuBois: sensitive, older sister of Stella; she's left her teaching job and been forced out of the family mansion, Belle Reve, in Laurel, Mississippi
- D. Others
 - 1. Steve & Eunice: the neighbors upstairs
 - 2. Mitch: Stanley's friend; Mitch's mom's ill so the men can't play poker at his house
- II. Plot Summary
 - A. Setting: after WWII in French Quarter (oldest part) of New Orleans, Louisiana
 - B. Premise: Blanche arrives at the Kowalski's to stay for a time.

 - 4. streetcar named Desire . . .: passion (desire) leads to death which leads to heaven
- C. Other Symbols
 - 1. Light: Blanche avoids the light
 - 2. Loneliness: Blanche's fear of being alone
 - 3. Music: music with Stanley & at the bowling alley, music with dead husband
 - 4. Illusions/Half Truths: alcohol
- D. Important Quotes: Know who said and why it's significant to the story . . .
 - 1. "They told me to take a street-car named Desire, and then, transfer to one called Cemeteries and ride six blocks and get off at -Elysian Fields."
 - 2. "God love you for a liar! Daylight never exposed so total a ruin! But you—you've put on some weight, yes, you're just as plump as a little partridge! And it's so becoming to you!"
